Wolfe Pointe Website – The "refreshed" Wolfe Pointe website is now available. The website will serve as the main source of information for owners in the Wolfe Pointe community. Any old and unnecessary content has been removed. The website also has new and helpful information that has been added. The biggest change is that we have enabled password protection on the Just For Owners page. This allows information such as the directory and the newsletter to be available and online to you but not to the public. The activity calendar is on the website now. It has all 12 months of 2024 with all of the recycling information for the year. This information will be available for you to check anytime rather than waiting for an email notification.

If there is an event on the calendar (with a flyer or a signup, or other information) you will see the event in blue and underlined. That will indicate that there is a link to more information. You will currently see this for the monthly food drive collection (now on the calendar for the full year) and Friday Nights at the Pool. More things will be added to the calendar as we have other events that have flyers or signups.

So take a look at the new website. Let us know what you think and what might make it even better! We will continue making updates and improvements as needed. And when you see Jane Irvine, Cathy Zambito or Debbie LaMorte, be sure to tell them what a good job they did redesigning the website! <u>Sad News</u> - I am very sorry to have to share the sad news that Tom Foster has passed away. Tom had many friends in Wolfe Pointe. He was a member of the Wolfe Pointe board for many years. Tom served as the Treasurer for a number of years as well. He was also a key member of the Roads and Grounds committee and he could be seen helping out with many projects around the community. Tom was a good man and a friend to everyone. He will truly be missed by all who knew him.

**Roads and Grounds** – Snow stakes to delineate the roadway edge will be installed soon around the neighborhood. Snow stake teams will be placing them on all of our roadways and adjacent to fire hydrants. Please do not disturb or remove the snow stakes once they are placed. Our contract with the snow removal company requires that we place them and maintain them throughout the winter months. If you see a stake that has been knocked down, please put it back if you are able or contact RJ Keller at R&G (rikeller3@comcast.net) and he will see that it is replaced. In addition, they are made of fiberglass and small splinters can come off if they are improperly handled. This can be painful and irritating. Parents, please remind children in the community to leave them alone to avoid injury. If you have to handle a snow stake, please do so with gloves to protect your hands. Delaware Electric Cooperative (DEC) is in the process of replacing our streetlights with new luminaires and LED lamps. Hopefully this will improve visibility and provide better security. You should see a difference at night throughout Wolfe Pointe.

### Wolfe Pointe – Improving Safety

- 1. Our focus at this time is community outreach and education in WP (newsletter notes, emails and mailings)
- Drivers need to SLOW DOWN and obey the posted speed limit.....Be Attentive! Put the Phone DOWN!
  The traffic monitoring data we collected shows that our average speeds are over 30 MPH.
- 3. No distracted driving, walking, cycling, scootering, etc. (Be Aware!)
- 4. Recommend cyclists wear protective headgear regardless of age.
- 5. Pedestrians and dog walkers should wear brightly colored clothing, especially at night and in the early morning (Be Visible) use flashlights and headlamps in the dark hours.
- 6. Walk on the left side of the road facing traffic when possible.
- Initially the board will be asking residents to slow down and take the necessary precautions when in community open space – Observe Speed Limits – <u>Be Attentive</u>!
- Perform another round of speed monitoring in 6-12 months to determine if recommended measures are working.

#### What To Do If Things Do Not Improve?.....

- 1. Additional signage and interactive speed monitoring equipment may be necessary to warn drivers of excessive speed.
- The installation of traffic calming measures (striping of pavement to narrow travel lanes, reduced speed limits, stop signs, speed humps/bumps, speed tables, etc.) may be our only recourse.
- 3. All of these measures will cost money and impact annual POA fees.

#### Architectural Review Committee (ARC)

There is a lot of new construction going on in the community, so if someone has a complaint against any of the new home sites, you should notify a Board member and/or Sandra Ware with the name of the Contractor.

That includes working on Sundays and after 7 pm.

Please Drive Safely – The days are getting shorter, the kids are back in school, and the nights are getting longer. The speed limit in Wolfe Pointe is 25. Please slow down, and keep your eyes on the road, not on your phone. If you have an "important" text to look at, then pull over and look at it. If you kill a child on a bike or in a stroller, it will be too late to say you are sorry.
