Pet Waste – There are always inconsiderate people who don't pick up after their pets. But there seems to be a lot more lately. I don't know why, because there is no reason for it. It is disgusting and very inconsiderate of the other Wolfe Pointe residents. Even if you forgot a poop bag, please come back and pick it up as soon as you can.

Assessment – There has been a Sussex County Assessment vehicle in the neighborhood for the last few days. I spoke with her a couple of times. She said she was working on the re-assessment project and that she would be done very soon now. She is not going into any homes, but she is interviewing as many property owners as she can to get accurate information for the reassessment. If she is unable to speak with someone, she will let the property owners know what assumptions were used to arrive at the property re-assessment and give the owners time to correct any incorrect assumptions. The re-assessment will be completed for the state in 2025 and all property in the state will be re-assessed every 5 years after that.

Roads and Grounds – We continue to monitor traffic speeds and say "thank you" to all those members of the community that have been more aware of their driving habits on our streets and helped improve safety.

The existing paver and stone pathways at the pool maintenance access and tennis court parking lot are going to be replaced soon. Once they are cleared and prepped for construction, we ask residents to stay away from the work areas until the new walkways are installed.

Please help R&G maintain the snow stakes in front of your homes. We are nearing the end of the snow season but, we sometimes get the heaviest snowfalls in March. Maintaining the stakes helps protect the turf grass on our road edge areas and in many cases, your irrigation heads that are next to the edge of the payement.

Ditch and swale maintenance is being performed by JM Diaz Landscaping throughout the neighborhood on some of our stormwater outfalls. This should be completed soon. Be aware they may be in some of our open space areas and drainage easements doing clean-up and repair work adjacent to your property. In addition, please check your driveway culverts for debris and blockages. March is typically our wettest month of the year and keeping runoff moving is critical to eliminate excessive ponding and keeping it off of roadways.
