Please Drive Safely – The days are getting shorter, the kids are back in school, and the nights are getting longer. The speed limit in Wolfe Pointe is 25. Please slow down, and keep your eyes on the road, not on your phone. If you have an "important" text to look at, then pull over and look at it. If you kill a child on a bike or in a stroller, it will be too late to say you are sorry.

Roads and Grounds - As we move into the autumn season, please keep leaves and debris out of ditches and inspect driveway culverts for hidden blockages so that excess runoff can drain properly. In addition, you can contact R&G if you see a drainage issue off of your property on Community Open Space.

Please let R&G know if any streetlight poles in the vicinity of your home are not working or are only on intermittently. The Delaware Electric Coop is very responsive in taking care of our service requests. Stickers with the DEC Pole# are mounted on the face of all of our street light poles.

### **Wolfe Pointe Safety Initiative 2023**

Our Overall Goal is a Calmer and Safer Neighborhood Based on Community Input

- Do We Have A Problem?.....The General Consensus is YES!
- ► The Wolfe Pointe Board Wants Everyone to Know Moving into 2024, Safety Is Our Primary Focus
- ► We Have Reviewed the DelDOT Traffic Calming Design Manual (2012) for Delaware
- ► We All Know Speed and Reckless/Distracted Driving Kills
- AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety (FTS) Found That Severe Injury for a Pedestrian Reaches 10% at an Impact Speed of 16 MPH, 25% at 23 MPH, 50% at 31 MPH, 75% at 39 MPH and 90% at 46 MPH.
- ► A UK Study Also Found That Someone Hit By a Car at 30 MPH is 5 Times More Likely to Be Killed Than a Car Traveling at 20 MPH (50% vs 10%). At 40 MPH the Likelihood of Death Rises to 90%!
- Drivers Need to <u>SLOW DOWN</u> and obey the posted Speed Limit.....Be Attentive! Put the Phone DOWN! The Traffic Monitoring Data We Collected Shows that Our Average Speeds are Over <u>30 MPH.</u>
- ► In Addition, Pedestrians and Bike Riders Need to Be Proactive Be Visible! (Pedestrians and Bikers get Distracted, too! Everyone Using our Roadways Need to Pay Attention) Use a Light at Night So You Can Be Seen!
- ▶ Walkers Stay to the Left Side of the Road, Facing Traffic, When Possible
- ► The Board May Choose to Perform another Round of Traffic Monitoring in 6-12 Months to Determine If there has been any improvement. All of the Options Being Considered will Cost Money, So Voluntary Compliance and Improved Safety Will Only Benefit Us All.

#### **Architectural Review Committee (ARC)**

There is a lot of new construction going on in the community, so if someone has a complaint against any of the new home sites, you should notify a Board member and/or Sandra Ware with the name of the Contractor.

That includes working on Sundays and after 7 pm.

Website Refresh – With the help of Cathy and Jim Zambito, Jane Irvine, and Debbie and Bob LaMorte, we have made a number of improvements to the Wolfe Pointe website. The Property Owners Home Page is now kept private with password protection.
