## From the President of the Wolfe Pointe Board

October is the tenth month of the year in the Gregorian calendar and has 31 days. It is situated between September and November and marks the beginning of the autumn season in the Northern Hemisphere. In the Southern Hemisphere, October is part of the spring season.

The name comes from the Latin word Octo meaning eight. In the ancient Roman calendar, October was the eighth month before January and February were added to the calendar, making it the tenth month in the modern system.

Special dates in October include: Halloween (October 31), a popular holiday celebrated with costumes, trick-or-treating, and festive decorations, Columbus Day (Second Monday in October);, a federal holiday in the United States commemorating Christopher Columbus's arrival in the Americas. Other observances may include Indigenous People's Day, Breast Cancer Awareness Month, and National Hispanic Heritage Month (which ends on October 15).

October is often regarded as a time of change and transition, both in nature and in personal reflection. Many people enjoy outdoor activities such as hiking, apple picking, and visiting pumpkin patches. The month is also associated with spooky themes, haunted houses, and horror movies due to Halloween. The birthstones for October are opal and tourmaline. The official flowers for October are the marigold and cosmos. October is commonly used as a theme for literature, art, and seasonal festivals.

## Fall Reminders for Wolfe Pointe Residents

**Culvert & Drainage Maintenance:** As we enter leaf season, please inspect your driveway culverts for debris and sediment. Leaves and buildup can block water flow and cause flooding. If needed, have your culverts cleaned and regraded to ensure proper drainage.

A reminder: do not plant trees or shrubs in roadside ditches or outfall swales. These areas are vital to our stormwater management system and must remain clear and functional.

**Wolfe Pointe Garden Committee (WPGC):** The newly formed WPGC will soon begin meeting to discuss maintenance and improvements to our landscaped areas. If you have a background in landscaping or horticulture—or simply a passion for plants—we'd love to hear from you! Stay tuned for more details.

**Visibility & Safety During Shorter Days:** With earlier nightfall and the upcoming time change, visibility is reduced. If you're walking or biking on our roads or pathways, please wear light-colored or reflective clothing and carry a flashlight so motorists can see you. Also, help keep our streetlights effective by trimming vegetation around light poles. Overgrown screen plantings near transformers can block light intended for the roadway. **RJ Keller**
